What is Transformational Prayer?

Basic definitions:

- Transformational: the ability to bring change (from one state to another)
- Prayer: communication with God (two-way communication)
- ► Transformational prayer: communication with God (prayer) that brings about positive change in a situation/circumstance

Prayer is a "means to an end". When we pray we must expect a response and respond in obedience when it is received.

Why is Transformational Prayer important?

The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. James 5:16, NIV


Quotes from George Otis, Jr. (Christian investigative researcher)
