A FEW THINGS ABOUT MANDATES

A mandate of fruitfulness, multiplication & dominion

Genesis 1:28- "Be fruitful & multiply and replenish the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the seas and over the fowls of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth "

The Provision

Genesis 1:29-30

And God said, "See, I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth, and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food. Also, to every beast of the earth, to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, in which there is life, I have given every green herb for food"; and it was so.

The Warning

Genesis 2:15-17

Then the LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it. ¹⁶ And <u>the LORD God commanded the man</u>, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

Adam failed to carry out his mandate because He did not pay attention to GOD's warning to avoid the very thing God warned him not to do.

The Consequence of Disobedience

Genesis 3:22-24

Then the LORD God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil. And now, lest he put out his hand and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live forever"— ²³ therefore the LORD God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken. ²⁴ So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life.

How did Adam's actions affect his generations?

Romans 5:12

"Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned—"

NOAH

A mandate to Build an Ark of Safety

Genesis 6:14-16

Make yourself an ark of gopherwood; make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and outside with pitch. ¹And this is how you shall make it: The length of the ark shall be three hundred cubits, its width fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits. You shall make a window for the ark, and you shall finish it to a cubit from above; and set the door of the ark in its side. You shall make it with lower, second, and third decks.

NOAH

God shared with Noah His plans to save Noah, his generations (his sons) and to preserve creation.

17 And behold, I Myself am bringing floodwaters on the earth, to destroy from under heaven all flesh in which is the breath of life; everything that is on the earth shall die. ¹⁸ But I will establish My covenant with you; and you shall go into the ark—you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you. ¹⁹ And of every living thing of all flesh you shall bring two of every sort into the ark, to keep them alive with you; they shall be male and female. ²⁰ Of the birds after their kind, of animals after their kind, and of every creeping thing of the earth after its kind, two of every kind will come to you to keep them alive. ²¹ And you shall take for yourself of all food that is eaten, and you shall gather it to yourself; and it shall be food for you and for them.

NOAH

How did God see Noah?

Hebrew 11:7

By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with <u>GODLY FEAR</u>, <u>prepared an ark for the saving of his household</u>, by which he condemned the world and became <u>heir of the righteousness</u> which is according to faith

Abraham received a mandate to Raise a Covenant Nation

Now the LORD had said to Abram:

<u>house</u>, To a land that I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you, And make your name great; And you shall be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, And I will curse him who curses you; And in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

The fullness of the mandate of God is not always fully revealed when it is first given. God in many instances reveals what we must do along the way to fulfil the mandate He has given.

Genesis 17: 1-2

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless. ² And I will make My covenant between Me and you, and will multiply you exceedingly."

Genesis 17: 10-12

This is My covenant which you shall keep, between Me and you and your descendants after you: Every male child among you shall be circumcised; ¹¹ and you shall be circumcised in the flesh of your foreskins, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between Me and you. ¹² He who is eight days old among you shall be circumcised, every male child in your generations, he who is born in your house or bought with money from any foreigner who is not your descendant.

Abraham trusted the mandate of God **IMPLICITLY**!!!

Hebrews 11: 1-19

By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, of whom it was said, "In Isaac your seed shall be called," concluding that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead, from which he also received him in a figurative sense.

How does the Bible record Abraham's response to the mandate given by God?

Hebrews 11: 8-10

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to the place which he would receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he dwelt in the land of promise as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise; for he waited for the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God.

MARY MOTHER OF JESUS

Received a mandate to allow the Saviour of the world to be supernaturally conceived and nurtured in her womb. She was a virgin and this seemed impossible.

Her response this request was "Let it be unto me according to your word" Luke 1:38

The mandate seemed impossible because of physical circumstances. She had never "known" a man.

NB: <u>OUR RESPONSE OF FAITH TO THE MANDATE MAKES THE</u> <u>IMPOSSIBLE</u>, <u>POSSIBLE</u>

THE APOSTLE PAUL

Received a mandate to take the message of Salvation to the gentiles. (Acts 9:22)

Read Act 8:1-3, Acts 9:1-2

We see that Paul (previously Saul) persecuted the church severely, he consented to the death of Stephen, imprisoned many Christians and would have even committed murder for his cause.

So we may ask -

- Why would God use such a man to carry out His mandate?
- Why would God choose me?

WHO CAN CARRY OUT GOD'S MANDATE?

God chooses who He desires to carry out His work, irrespective of:

- Past sins Mary Magdalene (John 8:1-11, Luke 8: 1-3, John 12:1-7)
- Past Actions -Paul (Acts 8:1-3, Acts 9: 1-2, Acts 9: 20-22)
- Education- The Disciples (Acts 4:13)
- Circumstances-Mary Mother of Jesus (Luke 1:26-38)
- Wealth/ Finances -Peter & John (Acts 3:6)
- Accusation/ Opposition Joshua (Zechariah 3:1), The Disciples (Acts 5:27-29)
- Shame The Disciples (Acts 5:41)

WHO CAN CARRY OUT GOD'S MANDATE?

1 Cor 1:26

For you see your calling, brethren, that <u>not many wise</u> according to the flesh, <u>not many mighty</u>, <u>not many noble</u>, are called. But <u>God has chosen</u> the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and <u>God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty</u>; and the <u>base things of the world and the things which are despised God has chosen</u>, and <u>the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are</u>, ²⁹ that no flesh should glory in His presence. ³⁰ But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God—and righteousness and sanctification and redemption— ³¹ that, as it is written, "He who glories, let him glory in the LORD.

WHAT CAN STOP US FROM CARRYING OUT GOD'S MANDATE???

Romans 8: 31-39

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written:

"For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter."

Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
